## TWO NEW PROGRAMS AT CCAP



CCAP Awarded a Grant From the RI Department of Education's Adult and Workforce Education and Family Literacy Program

CCAP's Doric Center has been awarded a grant from the Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE) to conduct an adult education and employment program. CCAP will establish an Adult & Workforce Education program for undereducated adults 18 years and older who have dropped out of school.

CCAP's Adult & Workforce Education program provides participants with a continuum of educational and supportive social services that will make them more competent and educated workers. While the program will outreach to young adults living in the Cranston and Providence areas, the program is open to young adults in all Rhode Island cities and towns.

CCAP's Head Start Program was chosen by RI MHRH's Division of Behavioral Healthcare Services to replicate a designated SAMSHA Model Program –The Incredible Years Training Series (IYS).
