## ► HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR:

- Completed planning to offer dental care to low income children and their families at CCAP health centers in Cranston and Warwick. Dental care will also be provided in Cranston and Warwick schools as well as Head Start and other child care programs.
- Received one of Ronald McDonald House Charities' Care Mobiles which will begin operation in the fall 2006. "The Molar Express" will bring free dental care to low income children at various sites across Rhode Island. This program is being developed jointly with Eastbay Community Action Program and Thundermist Health Center.
- Acquired additional funding to assisted local renters and homeowners with their energy costs and helped many people avoid shut offs.
- Coordinated efforts to reduce substance abuse in the City of Cranston as the lead agency for the Cranston Substance Abuse Task Force.
- As a founding partner of the Providence Skills Center, created a job training site at the Providence Place Mall offering GED preparation, customer service classes and a CVS mock pharmacy that prepares people to become Pharmacy Technicians.
- As partners in URI's Food Stamp Outreach Program, conducted extensive outreach, determined eligibility and assisted people in applying for the State Food Stamp Program
- Assisted many people in increasing their income by reducing their federal tax burden through the Earned Income Tax Credit Program.
